EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- i. This is the Quarterly Environmental Monitoring and Audit (EM&A) Report – [November 2014](#) to [January 2015](#) specific for Environmental Permit no. EP-122/2002/D. The EM&A report is prepared by the Environmental Team (ET) employed under Contract No. HK/2011/07 – Wan Chai Development Phase II and Central Wanchai Bypass – Sampling, Field Measurement and Testing Works (Stage 2). This report presents the environmental monitoring and audit findings and information during the period from [1st November 2014](#) to [31th January 2015](#).

Construction Activities for the Reported Period

- ii. During this reporting period, the principle work activities of the contract is included as follows:
Contract no. HK/2012/08 – Wan Chai Development Phase II – Central- Wan Chai Bypass at Wan Chai West

- iv. Limit level exceedances were recorded on 6 and 29 November 2014 during daytime in the November 2014 reporting period. After the investigation, the exceedances were concluded as not project related.

- v. Limit level exceedances were recorded on 8, 20, 23, 27, 29, 30 and 31 December 2014 during daytime in the December 2014 reporting period. After the investigation, the exceedances were concluded as not project related
[January 2015](#)
- vi. Limit level exceedances were recorded on 2, 3 and 15 January 2015 during daytime in the January 2015 reporting period. After the investigation, the exceedances were concluded as not project related.
- vii. Due to safety concerned, the location of the continuous noise monitoring station at City Hall was finely adjusted to the roof of the City Hall, Low Block on 1 May 2013.

Air Quality MonitoringNovember 2014

- viii. No action and limit level exceedance was recorded in the November 2014 reporting period.

December 2014

- ix. No action and limit level exceedance was recorded in the December 2014 reporting period.

January 2015

- x. Action level exceedances were recorded at ACL1 – City Hall and ACL2a – Contractor HK/2012/08 Site Office on 21 January 2015 during 24hr TSP monitoring in the January 2015 reporting period.
- xi. Due to the defective electricity supply found at monitoring station ACL1 and the advice from City Hall Building Management, the air monitoring station ACL1 – City Hall was finely adjusted on 28 Feb 2014 to an alternate electricity supply.
- xii. 1-hour and 24-hour Total Suspended Particulates (TSP) monitoring were conducted at ACL1 – City Hall and ACL2 – PLA Barracks (ACL2a Contractor HK/2012/08 Site Office since 7 December 2013) on every six days basis.
- xiii. Due to the large scale renovation works at People’s Liberation Army Headquarter, a Proposal for Relocation of Air Quality Monitoring Station at People’s Liberation Army Headquarter (ACL2) was formally submitted to EPD on 4th November, 2013.
- xiv. Air Quality Monitoring at ACL2 was temporarily suspended during the period from 14th November, 2013 to 3rd December, 2013.
- xv. The Proposal for Relocation of Air Quality Monitoring Station at People’s Liberation Army Headquarter (ACL2) was approved by EPD on 27 November 2013.
- xvi. According to the approved proposal for relocation of Air Quality Monitoring station, the action and limit levels of ACL2a shall adopt the reference monitoring result from the baseline air monitoring report for EP/364/2009 in 22 April 2010 in which approved by EPD.
- xvii. The air quality monitoring at ACL2a – Contractor HK/2012/08 Site Office was commenced on 7 December 2013.

Water Quality Monitoring

- xviii. As confirmed by WDII RSS, the dredging works, seawall modification works and other associated works undertaken at Central Reclamation Phase III by Contractor HK/2012/08 was commenced in late September 2014. According to the approved EM&A manual under EP-122/2002/D, water quality monitoring shall be implemented at the Central Reclamation Phase III works area accordingly to assess any potential water quality impact during the construction period.
- xix. Water quality monitoring at M5B and Culvert J were conducted three days per weeks during the reporting period starting from 26 September 2014.



November 2014

- xx. One limit level exceedance of suspended solids was recorded on 10 November 2014 during flood tide in the November 2014 reporting period. After the investigation, the exceedance was concluded as non-project related.

December 2014

- xxi. No action or limit level exceedance was recorded in the December 2014 reporting period.

January 2015

- xxii. No action or limit level exceedance was recorded in the January 2015 reporting period

Complaints, Notifications of Summons and Successful Prosecutions

- xxiii. There was no environmental complaint recorded in the reporting period.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Scope of the Report

1.1.1. Lam Geotechnics Limited (LGL) has been appointed to work as the Environmental Team (ET) under Environmental Permit no. EP-122/2002/D to implement the Environmental Monitoring and Audit (EM&A) programme as stipulated in the EM&A Manual of the approved Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Report Central Reclamation Phase III - Studies, Site Investigation, Design and Construction (Register No.: AEIAR-040/2001) since 1 May 2013.

1.1.2. This report documents the finding of EM&A works for Environmental Permit (EP) no. EP-122/2002/D, during the period from **1st November 2014** to **31th January 2015**.

2. PROJECT BACKGROUND

2.1 Background

2.1.1 Central Reclamation Phase III - Studies, Site Investigation, Design and Construction (hereafter called “the Project”) are Designated Project (DP) under the Environmental Impact Assessment Ordinance (Cap. 499) (EIAO). The Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Reports for Central Reclamation Phase III - Studies, Site Investigation, Design and Construction (Register No. AEIAR-040/2001) has been approved on 31 August 2001.

2.2 Scope of the Project and Site Description

2.2.1. The design and construction of Central Reclamation Phase III involves the permanent reclamation and construction and operation of a trunk road and its road tunnel that is shown at [Figure 2.1](#).

2.2.2. The key purpose of the study area encompasses the area of Victoria Harbour to the southeast of the new Outlying Islands Ferry Piers and north of Edinburgh Place and Lung Wui Road. The area extends eastward to Fenwick Pier Street and the Fleet Arcade, and includes the existing GPO, Star Ferry Piers, Queens Pier, City Hall, PLA Headquarters, Hong Kong Red Cross Headquarters building and the Tamar Site. The scope of the Central Reclamation, Phase III includes:

- Reclamation and seawalls, roads and associated services, North Island Line Protection Works and Advance Trunk Road Tunnel (ATRT) for the CWB;
- Re provisioning of Star Ferry Pier, public landing steps, wallah wallah moorings, and motor boat/launch operators' kiosks;
- External cooling water systems which consist of the cooling water pumping shells for future developments, and the re provisioning of existing cooling water pumping stations and associated pipework systems and E&M works;
- Re provisioning of existing Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD)'s facilities;
- Provision of a flood relief path, stormwater culvert extensions, upgrading of hinterland stormwater drainage resulting from the reclamation, demolition of the existing waterfront structures and necessary landscaping;
- The Hong Kong Station Extended Overrun Tunnel (EOT) and associated ventilation structures entrusted for construction within the CRIII works;
- Re provisioning of the Government Heliport at the Wan Chai PCWA and re provisioning of the Wan Chai PCWA at Chai Wan Basin.

2.2.3. The project also contains various Schedule 2 DPs that, under the EIAO, require Environmental Permits (EPs) to be granted by the DEP before they may be either constructed or operated. **Table 2.1** summarises the four individual DPs under this Project. **Figure 2.1** shows the locations of these Schedule 2 DPs.

2.2.4. The designated project work I (DP1) was awarded to China State-Leader Joint Venture HK/2012/08 as part of the Project works by the Civil Engineering and Development Department (CEDD). The construction work under Contract no. HK/2012/08 was commenced on 27 May 2013.

2.3 Project Organization and Contact Personnel

2.3.1 Civil Engineering and Development Department is the overall project controllers for the Central Reclamation Phase III Project. For the construction phase of the Project, Project Engineer, Contractor(s), Environmental Team and Independent Environmental Checker are appointed to manage and control environmental issues.

2.3.2 The proposed project organization and lines of communication with respect to environmental protection works are shown in **Figure 2.2**. Key personnel and contact particulars are summarized in **Table 2.2**:

3. MONITORING REQUIREMENTS

3.1. Noise Monitoring

NOISE MONITORING STATIONS

- 3.1.1. The continuous noise monitoring station for the Project is listed and shown in **Table 3.1** and **Figure 3.1**. [Appendix 3.1](#) shows the established Action/Limit Levels for the monitoring works.

NOISE MONITORING PARAMETERS, FREQUENCY AND DURATION

- 3.1.2. Continuous 24-hour noise monitoring shall be carried out at the designated monitoring stations. The following is an initial guide on the regular monitoring frequency for each station on a 24 hours daily basis when noise generating activities are underway:
- One set of measurements between 0700 and 1900 hours on normal weekdays.
 - One set of measurements between 1900 and 2300 hours on normal weekdays and 0700 and 2300 hours on public holidays.
 - One set of measurements between 2300 and 0700 hours on next day on everyday.
- 3.1.3. If construction works are extended to include works during the hours of 1900 – 0700 as well as public holidays and Sundays, additional weekly impact monitoring shall be carried out during respective restricted hours periods. Applicable permits under NCO shall be obtained by the Contractor.

MONITORING EQUIPMENT

- 3.1.4. As referred to in the Technical Memorandum TM issued under the NCO, sound level meters in compliance with the International Electrotechnical Commission Publications 651: 1979 (Type 1) and 804: 1985 (Type 1) specifications shall be used for carrying out the noise monitoring. Immediately prior to and following each noise measurement the accuracy of the sound level meter shall be checked using an acoustic calibrator generating a known sound pressure level at a known frequency. Measurements may be accepted as valid only if the calibration level from before and after the noise measurement agrees to within 1.0 dB.
- 3.1.5. Noise measurements shall not be made in fog, rain, wind with a steady speed exceeding 5 m/s or wind with gusts exceeding 10 m/s. The wind speed shall be checked with a portable wind speed meter capable of measuring the wind speed in m/s.

3.1.6. The sound level meter shall be checked using an acoustic calibrator generating a known sound pressure level at a known frequency before deployment to the site and during each site visit. Measurements will be accepted as valid only if the calibration level from before and after the noise measurement agrees to within 1.0 dB.

3.2. Air Monitoring

AIR QUALITY MONITORING STATIONS

3.2.1. The air monitoring stations for the Project are listed and shown in **Table 3.2** and **Figure 3.1**. **Appendix 3.1** shows the established Action/Limit Levels for the monitoring works.

AIR MONITORING PARAMETERS, FREQUENCY AND DURATION

3.2.2. One-hour and 24-hour TSP levels should be measured to indicate the impacts of construction dust on air quality. The 24-hour TSP levels shall be measured by following the standard high volume sampling method as set out in the Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter 1 (Part 50), Appendix B.

3.2.3. All relevant data including temperature, pressure, weather conditions, elapsed-time meter reading for the start and stop of the sampler, identification and weight of the filter paper, and any other local atmospheric factors affecting or affected by site conditions, etc., shall be recorded down in detail.

3.2.4. For regular impact monitoring, the sampling frequency of at least once in every six-days, shall be strictly observed at all the monitoring stations for 24-hour TSP monitoring. For 1-hour TSP monitoring, the sampling frequency of at least three times in every six-days should be undertaken when the highest dust impact occurs.

SAMPLING PROCEDURE AND MONITORING EQUIPMENT

3.2.5. High volume samplers (HVSs) in compliance with the following specifications shall be used for carrying out the 1-hour and 24-hour TSP monitoring:

- 0.6 – 1.7 m³ per minute adjustable flow range;
- Equipped with a timing / control device with +/- 5 minutes accuracy for 24 hours operation;

- Installed with elapsed-time meter with +/- 2 minutes accuracy for 24 hours operation;
- Capable of providing a minimum exposed area of 406 cm²;
- Flow control accuracy: +/- 2.5% deviation over 24-hour sampling period;
- Equipped with a shelter to protect the filter and sampler;
- Incorporated with an electronic mass flow rate controller or other equivalent devices;
- Equipped with a flow recorder for continuous monitoring;
- Provided with a peaked roof inlet;
- Incorporated with a manometer;
- Able to hold and seal the filter paper to the sampler housing at horizontal position;
- Easily changeable filter; and
- Capable of operating continuously for a 24-hour period.

3.2.6. Initial calibration of dust monitoring equipment shall be conducted upon installation and thereafter at bi-monthly intervals. The transfer standard shall be traceable to the internationally recognized primary standard and be calibrated annually. The concern parties such as IEC shall properly document the calibration data for future reference. All the data should be converted into standard temperature and pressure condition.

LABORATORY MEASUREMENT / ANALYSIS

3.2.7. A clean laboratory with constant temperature and humidity control, and equipped with necessary measuring and conditioning instruments to handle the dust samples collected, shall be available for sample analysis, and equipment calibration and maintenance. The laboratory should be HOKLAS accredited.

3.2.8. Filter paper of size 8" x 10" shall be labelled before sampling. It shall be a clean filter paper with no pinholes, and shall be conditioned in a humidity-controlled chamber for over 24-hours and be pre-weighed before use for the sampling.

3.2.9. After sampling, the filter paper loaded with dust shall be kept in a clean and tightly sealed plastic bag. The filter paper shall then be returned to the laboratory for reconditioning in the humidity controlled chamber followed by accurate weighing by an electronic balance with readout down to 0.1 mg. The balance shall be regularly calibrated against a traceable standard.

3.2.10. All the collected samples shall be kept in a good condition for 6 months before disposal.

3.3. Water Quality Monitoring

WATER QUALITY MONITORING STATIONS

3.3.1 The water quality monitoring stations for the Project are listed and shown in **Table 3.3** and [Figure 3.1](#). [Appendix 3.1](#) shows the established Action/Limit Levels for the monitoring works.

WATER QUALITY PARAMETERS

- 3.3.2 Monitoring of dissolved oxygen (DO), turbidity and suspended solids (SS) shall be carried out at WSD flushing water intakes and cooling water intakes. DO and Turbidity are measured in-situ while SS is determined in laboratory.
- 3.3.3 In association with the water quality parameters, other relevant data shall also be measured, such as monitoring location/position, time, sampling depth, water temperature, pH, salinity, dissolved oxygen (DO) saturation, weather conditions, sea conditions, tidal stage, and any special phenomena and work underway at the construction site etc.

SAMPLING PROCEDURES AND MONITORING EQUIPMENT

- 3.3.4 The interval between two sets of monitoring should not be less than 36 hours except where there are exceedances of Action and/or Limit Levels, in which case the monitoring frequency will be increased. **Table 3.4** shows the proposed monitoring frequency and water quality parameters. Duplicate in-situ measurements and water sampling should be carried out in each sampling event. For selection of tides for in-situ measurement and water sampling, tidal range of individual flood and ebb tides should be not less than 0.5m.

Notes:

- 1. For selection of tides for in-situ measurement and water sampling, tidal range of individual flood and ebb tides should be not less than 0.5m.
- 2. Turbidity should be measured in situ whereas SS should be determined by laboratory.

DISSOLVED OXYGEN AND TEMPERATURE MEASURING EQUIPMENT

3.3.5 The instrument should be a portable, weatherproof dissolved oxygen measuring instrument complete with cable, sensor, comprehensive operation manuals, and use a DC power source. It should be capable of measuring:

- a dissolved oxygen level in the range of 0-20 mg/l and 0-200% saturation
- a temperature of 0-45 degree Celsius

3.3.6 It should have a membrane electrode with automatic temperature compensation complete with a cable. Sufficient stocks of spare electrodes and cables should be available for replacement where necessary. (e.g. YSI model 59 meter, YSI 5739 probe, YSI 5795A submersible stirrer with reel and cable or an approved similar instrument).

3.3.7 Should salinity compensation not be build-in in the DO equipment, in-situ salinity shall be measured to calibrate the DO equipment prior to each DO measurement.

TURBIDITY MEASUREMENT INSTRUMENT

3.3.8 The instrument should be a portable, weatherproof turbidity-measuring instrument complete with comprehensive operation manual. The equipment should use a DC power source. It should have a photoelectric sensor capable of measuring turbidity between 0-1000 NTU and be complete with a cable (e.g. Hach model 2100P or an approved similar instrument).

SAMPLER

3.3.9 A water sampler comprises a transparent PVC cylinder, with a capacity of not less than 2 litres, and can be effectively sealed with latex cups at both ends. The sampler should have a positive latching system to keep it open and prevent premature closure until released by a messenger when the sampler is at the selected water depth (e.g. Kahlsico Water Sampler or an approved similar instrument).

SAMPLE CONTAINER AND STORAGE

3.3.10 Water samples for suspended solids measurement should be collected in high-density polythene bottles, packed in ice (cooled to 4°C without being frozen), and delivered to ALS Technichem (HK) Pty Ltd. as soon as possible after collection for analysis.

WATER DEPTH DETECTOR

3.3.11 A portable, battery-operated echo sounder shall be used for the determination of water depth at each designated monitoring station. This unit can either be handheld or affixed to the bottom of the workboat, if the same vessel is to be used throughout the monitoring programme.

SALINITY

3.3.12 A portable salinometer capable of measuring salinity in the range of 0-40 ppt shall be provided for measuring salinity of the water at each of monitoring location.

MONITORING POSITION EQUIPMENT

- 3.3.13 A hand-held or boat-fixed type digital Global Positioning System (GPS) with waypoint bearing indication or other equivalent instrument of similar accuracy shall be provided and used during monitoring to ensure the monitoring vessel is at the correct location before taking measurements.

CALIBRATION OF IN-SITU INSTRUMENTS

- 3.3.14 All in-situ monitoring instrument shall be checked, calibrated and certified by a laboratory accredited under HOKLAS or equivalent before use, and subsequently re-calibrated at 3 monthly intervals throughout all stages of the water quality monitoring. Responses of sensors and electrodes should be checked with certified standard solutions before each use. Wet bulb calibration for a DO meter shall be carried out before measurement at each monitoring location.
- 3.3.15 For the on site calibration of field equipment by the ET, the BS 127:1993, "Guide to Field and on-site test methods for the analysis of waters" should be observed.
- 3.3.16 Sufficient stocks of spare parts should be maintained for replacements when necessary. Backup monitoring equipment shall also be made available so that monitoring can proceed uninterrupted even when some equipment is under maintenance, calibration, etc.

LABORATORY MEASUREMENT / ANALYSIS

- 3.3.17 Analysis of suspended solids has been carried out in a HOKLAS accredited laboratory, ALS Technichem (HK) Pty Ltd. Water samples of about 1L shall be collected at the monitoring stations for carrying out the laboratory SS determination. The SS determination work shall start within 24 hours after collection of the water samples. The SS determination shall follow APHA 19ed or equivalent methods subject to the approval of IEC and EPD.

4. MONITORING RESULTS

4.0.1. The environmental monitoring will be implemented based on the division of works areas of each designed project managed under different contracts with separate FEP applied by individual contractors. Overall layout showing work areas of various contracts, latest status of work commencement and monitoring stations is shown in **Figure 2.1** and **Figure 3.1**. The monitoring results are presented in according to the Individual Contract(s).

4.0.2. In the reporting period, the concurrent contract is:

- Contract no. HK/2012/08 – Wan Chai Development Phase II – Central – Wan Chai Bypass at Wan Chai West.

4.1. Noise Monitoring Results

4.1.1 Due to safety concerned, the location of the continuous noise monitoring station at City Hall was finely adjusted to the roof of the City Hall, Low Block on 1 May 2013.

4.1.2 The proposed division of noise monitoring stations is summarized in Table 4.1 below.

November 2014

4.1.3 Limit level exceedances were recorded on 6 and 29 November 2014 during daytime in the November 2014 reporting month. After checking with contractor of HK/2012/08, diaphragm wall excavation were conducted on 6 and 29 November 2014. In addition, charity relay race and public concert was observed at the public area opposite to the noise monitoring station on 6 November 2014 and 29 November 2014 respectively. In view of the above, the exceedances were considered as non-project related and contributed by nearby public activities.

December 2014

4.1.4 Limit level exceedances were recorded on 8, 20, 23, 27, 29, 30 and 31 December 2014 during daytime in the December 2014 reporting month. After checking with contractor of HK/2012/08, diaphragm wall construction and socket H piling were conducted on 8, 20, 23, 27,

29, 30 and 31 December 2014 while chilling plant maintenance and upgrading works (with use of circular steel cutter) was observed on-going at City Hall roof top location adjacent to the noise monitoring station in the reporting month. In view of the above, the exceedances were considered as non-project related and contributed by the maintenance work by City Hall.

January 2015

4.1.5 Limit level exceedances were recorded on 2, 3 and 15 January 2015 during daytime in the January 2015 reporting period. After checking with contractor of HK/2012/08 chilling plant maintenance and upgrading works (with use of circular steel cutter) were observed on-going at City Hall roof top location adjacent to the noise monitoring station in the reporting month. In view of the above, the exceedances were considered as non-project related and contributed by the maintenance work by City Hall.

4.1.6 Continuous noise monitoring results measured in this reporting period are reviewed and summarized. Details of continuous noise monitoring results and graphical presentation can be referred to [Appendix 4.1](#)

4.2. Air Monitoring Results

4.2.1 The proposed division of air monitoring stations are summarized in **Table 4.2** below.

4.2.2 1-hour and 24-hour Total Suspended Particulates (TSP) monitoring were conducted at ACL1 – City Hall and ACL2 – PLA Barracks (ACL2a Contractor HK/2012/08 Site Office since 7 December 2013) on every six days basis.

4.2.3 Due to the large scale renovation works at People’s Liberation Army Headquarter, a Proposal for Relocation of Air Quality Monitoring Station at People’s Liberation Army Headquarter (ACL2) was formally submitted to EPD on 4th November, 2013.

4.2.4 Air Quality Monitoring at ACL2 was temporarily suspended during the period from 14th November, 2013 to 3rd December, 2013.

4.2.5 The Proposal for Relocation of Air Quality Monitoring Station at People’s Liberation Army Headquarter (ACL2) was approved by EPD on 27 November 2013.

4.2.6 According to the approved proposal for relocation of Air Quality Monitoring station, the action and limit levels of ACL2a shall adopt the reference monitoring result from the baseline air monitoring report for EP/364/2009 in 22 April 2010 in which approved by EPD.

4.2.7 The air quality monitoring at ACL2a – Contractor HK/2012/08 Site Office was commenced on 7 December 2013.

November 2014

4.2.8 No action or limit level exceedance was recorded in the November 2014 reporting period.

December 2014

4.2.9 No action or limit level exceedance was recorded in the December 2014 reporting period.

January 2015

4.2.10 Action level exceedances were recorded at ACL1 – City Hall and ACL2a – Contractor HK/2012/08 Site Office on 21 January 2015 during 24hr TSP monitoring in the January 2015 reporting period.

4.2.11 Although D-wall and stock H-pile construction were conducted during 24hr TSP monitoring on 21 January 2015, the air pollution level of ambient air quality was considered as the major contribution to air quality impact. The Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) recorded by EPD at Central/Western District during the monitoring period was ranged from 4 to 10+ indicating a severely high concentration of air pollutants. In addition, similar construction activities and mitigation measures were undertaken in previous monitoring, no exceedance was recorded. As such, the implemented measures were considered effective and exceedance was considered as non-project related.

4.2.12 The air quality monitoring results measured in this reporting period are reviewed and summarized. Details of air monitoring results and graphical presentation can be referred in [Appendix 4.2](#).

After checking with contractor, no marine works was conducted under contract HK/2012/08 on the monitoring date, silt curtain installed around intake monitoring station was generally in order. In view of no marine activities conducted on the monitoring date and no further exceedance was recorded in subsequent monitoring, it was considered that the exceedance was not project related.

December 2014

4.3.5 No action and limit level exceedance was recorded in the December 2014 reporting month.

January 2015

4.3.6 No action and limit level exceedance was recorded in the January 2015 reporting month.

7. CUMULATIVE CONSTRUCTION IMPACT DUE TO THE CONCURRENT PROJECTS

- 7.0.1. This section addresses the relevant cumulative construction impact due to the concurrent activities of the current projects including the Central Reclamation Phase III (CRIII), Wan Chai Development Phase II (WDII), Central-WanChai Bypass (CWB), Island Eastern Corridor Link projects (IECL) and Wan Chai Development Phase II – Central – Wan Chai Bypass at Wan Chai East (CWB Tunnel).
- 7.0.2. According to the Final EM&A report of Central Reclamation Phase III (CRIII) for Contract HK 12/02, the major construction activities were completed by end of January 2014 and no construction activities were undertaken thereafter and the water quality monitoring was completed in October 2011. As such, it is considered that there were no cumulative construction impact due to the concurrent activities of the current projects with the Central Reclamation Phase III (CRIII) undertaken by contractor HK12/02 in the reporting month.
- 7.0.3. According to the construction programme of Wan Chai Development Phase II, Central-Wan Chai Bypass and Island Eastern Corridor Link projects, the major construction activities under Wan Chai Development Phase II were marine works at HKCEC areas, tunnel works and Wan Chai Ferry Pier demolition works at Wan Chai East and filling works at Wan Chai West. The major construction activities under Central-Wan Chai Bypass and Island Eastern Corridor Link Projects were bridge construction and road works at Central Interchange, land base bored pilling works at Victoria Park Road and ELS works at Victoria Park, segment launching works and tunnel works at North Point area. Marine-based construction activities were removal of temporary reclamation at TS4 and EX-PCWA and seawall construction and filling works at TS3 at Causeway Bay Typhoon Shelter in the reporting month.
- 7.0.4. The major environmental impacts generated from tunnel works at Central and tunnel works at Wan Chai East, IECL and Causeway Bay Typhoon Shelter were undertaken in the reporting period. No significant air impact from construction activities was anticipated in the reporting period. Besides, no project-related exceedances were recorded during the water, air and noise environmental monitoring events in the reporting period. Thus, it is evaluated that the cumulative construction impact from the concurrent projects including Wan Chai Development Phase II was insignificant.

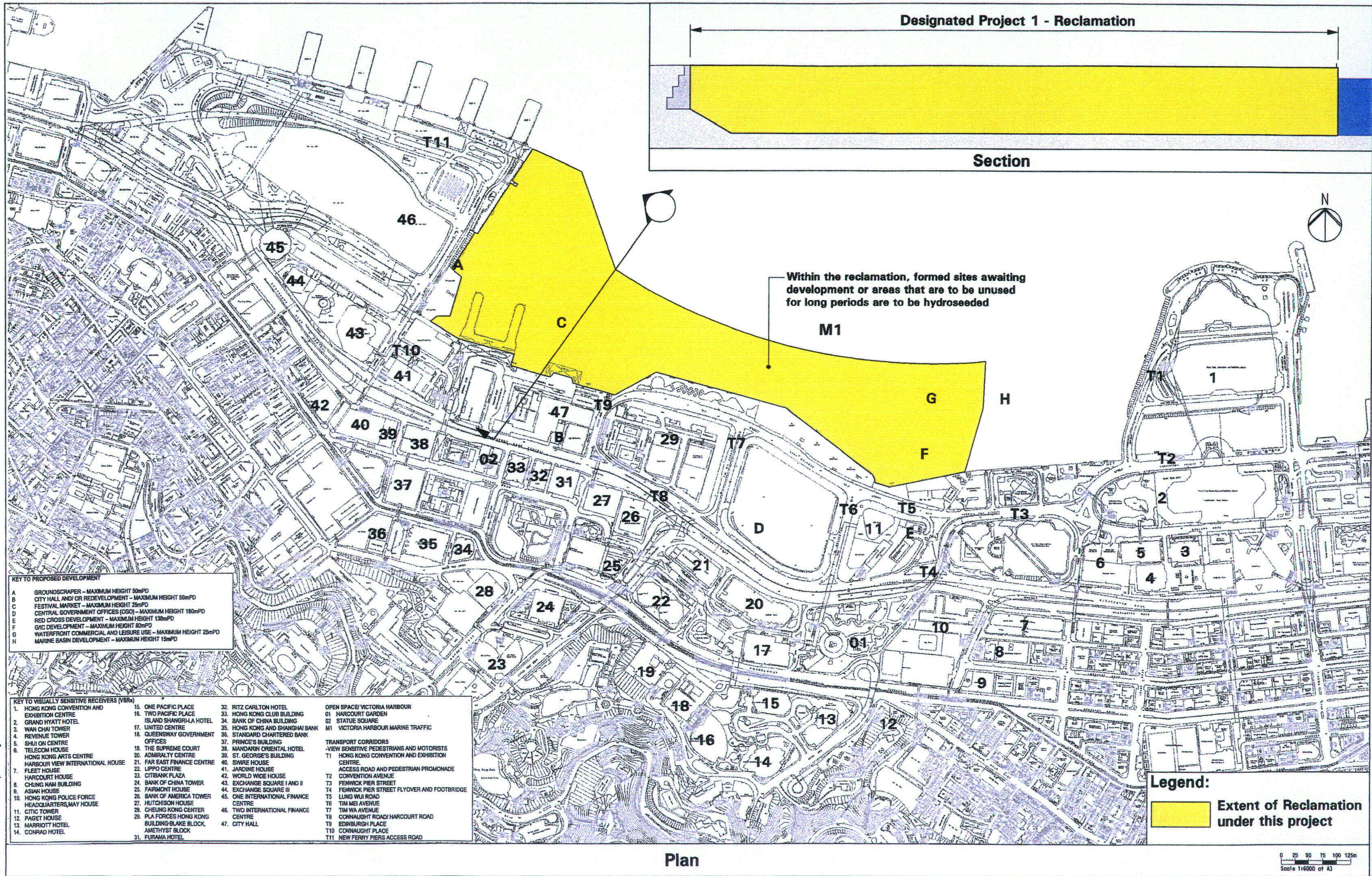
8. CONCLUSION

Project Layout

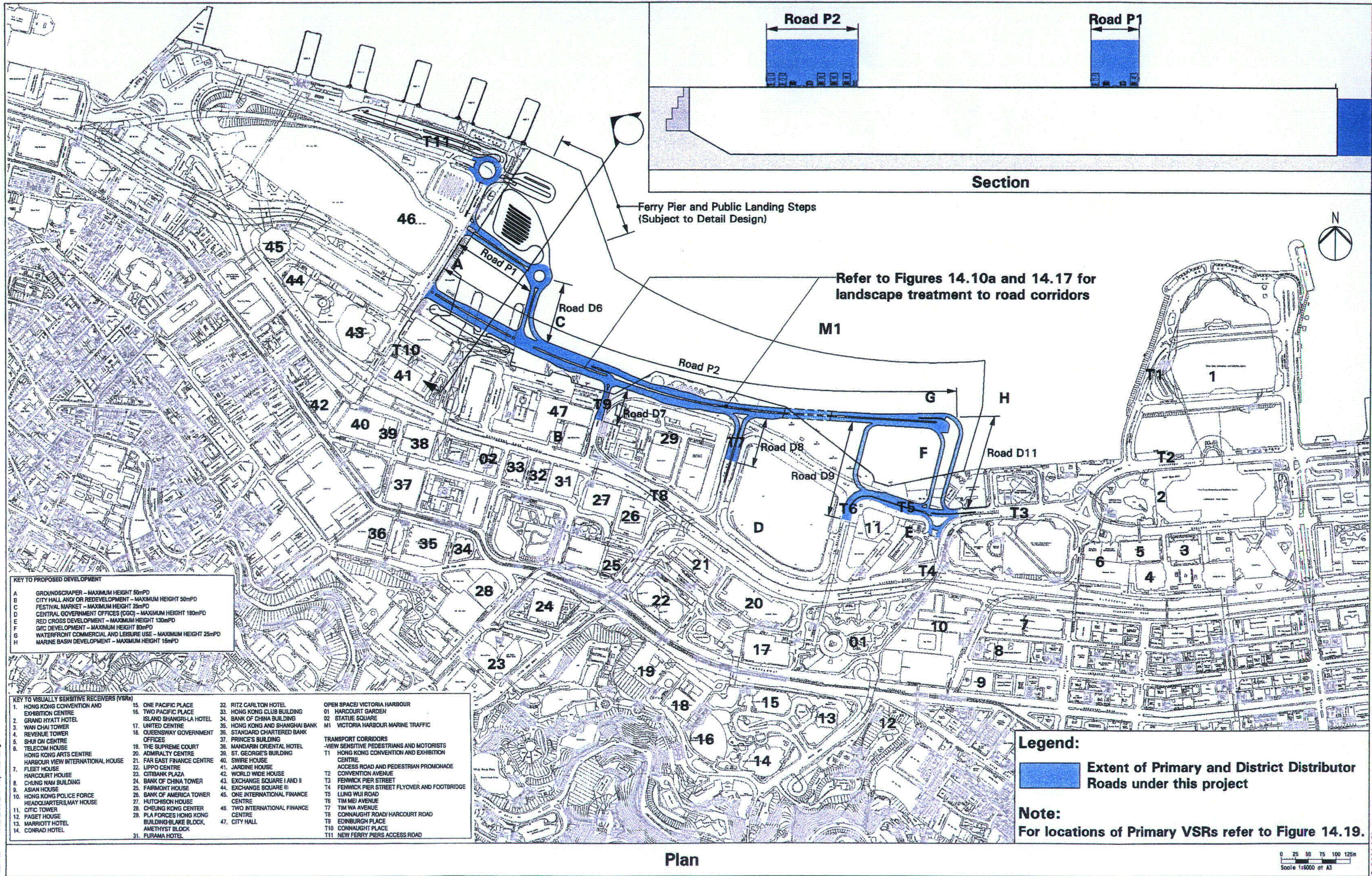

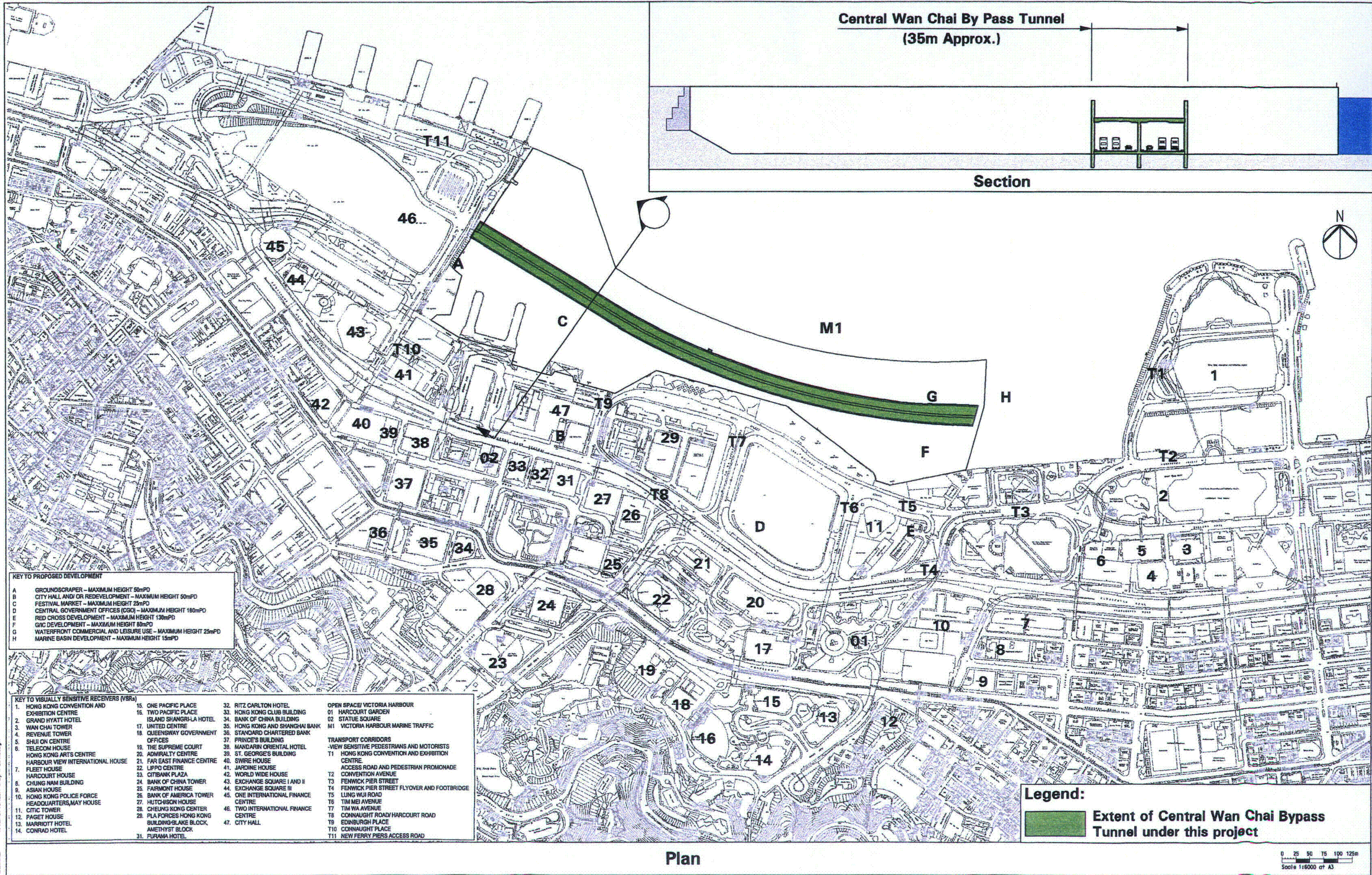

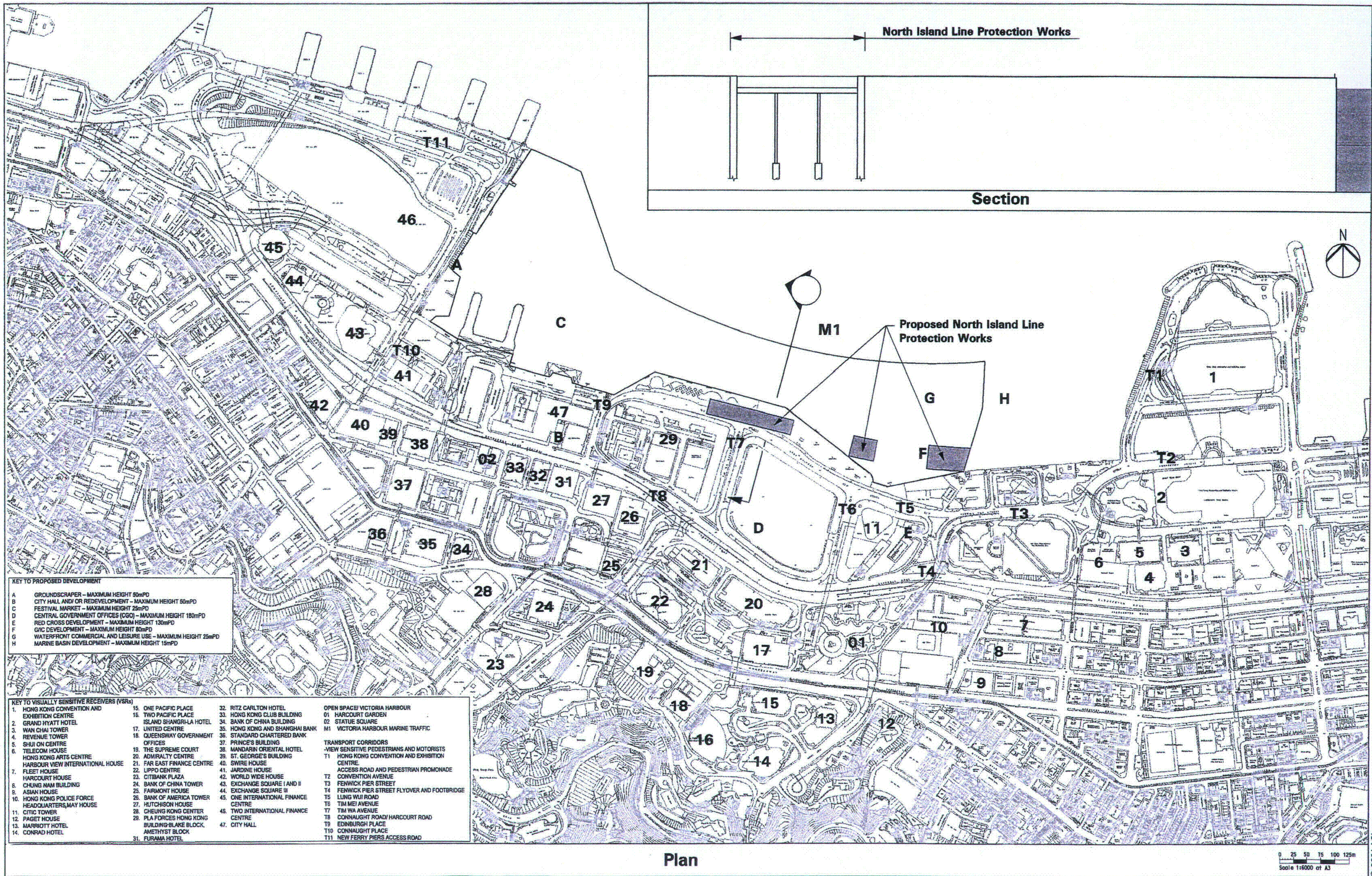

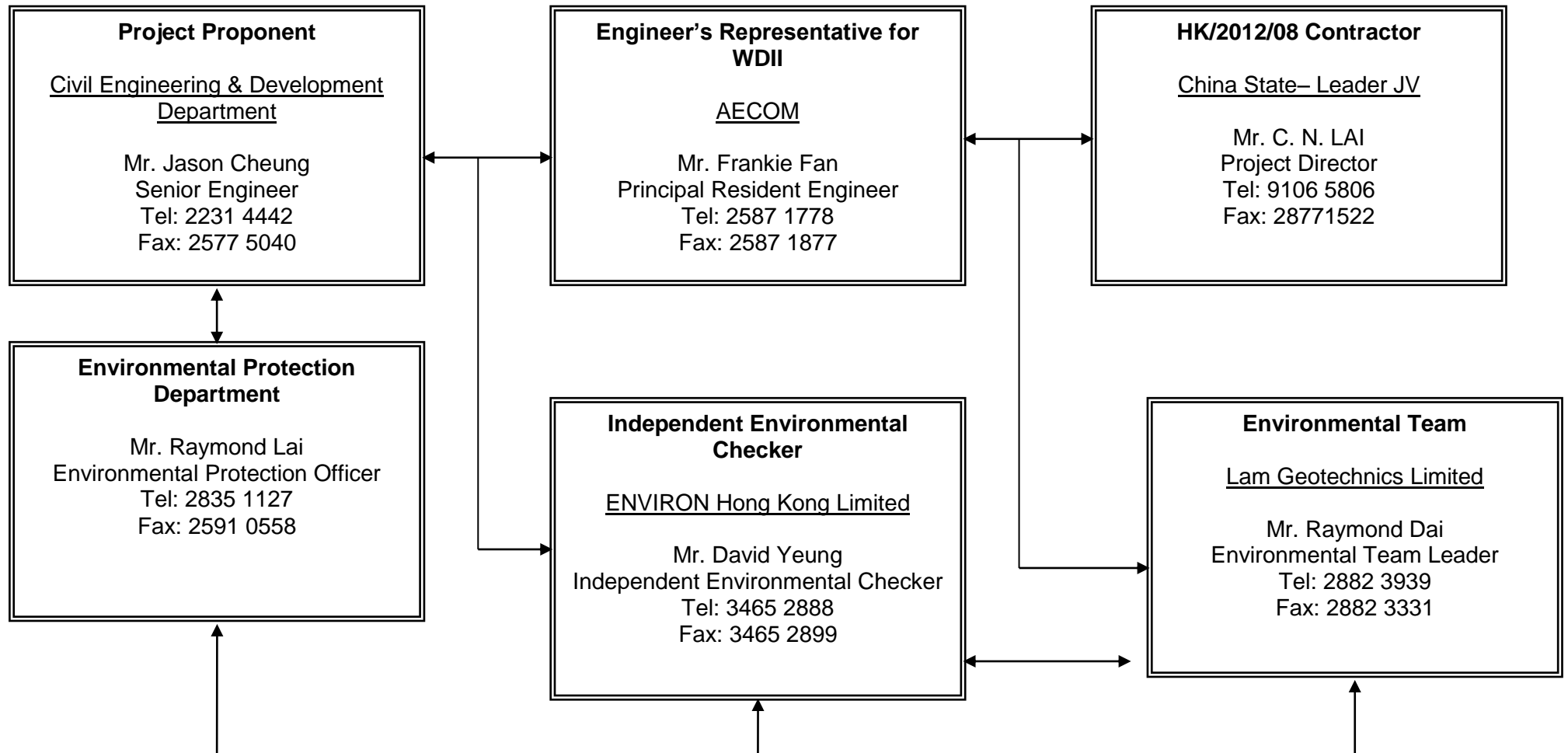

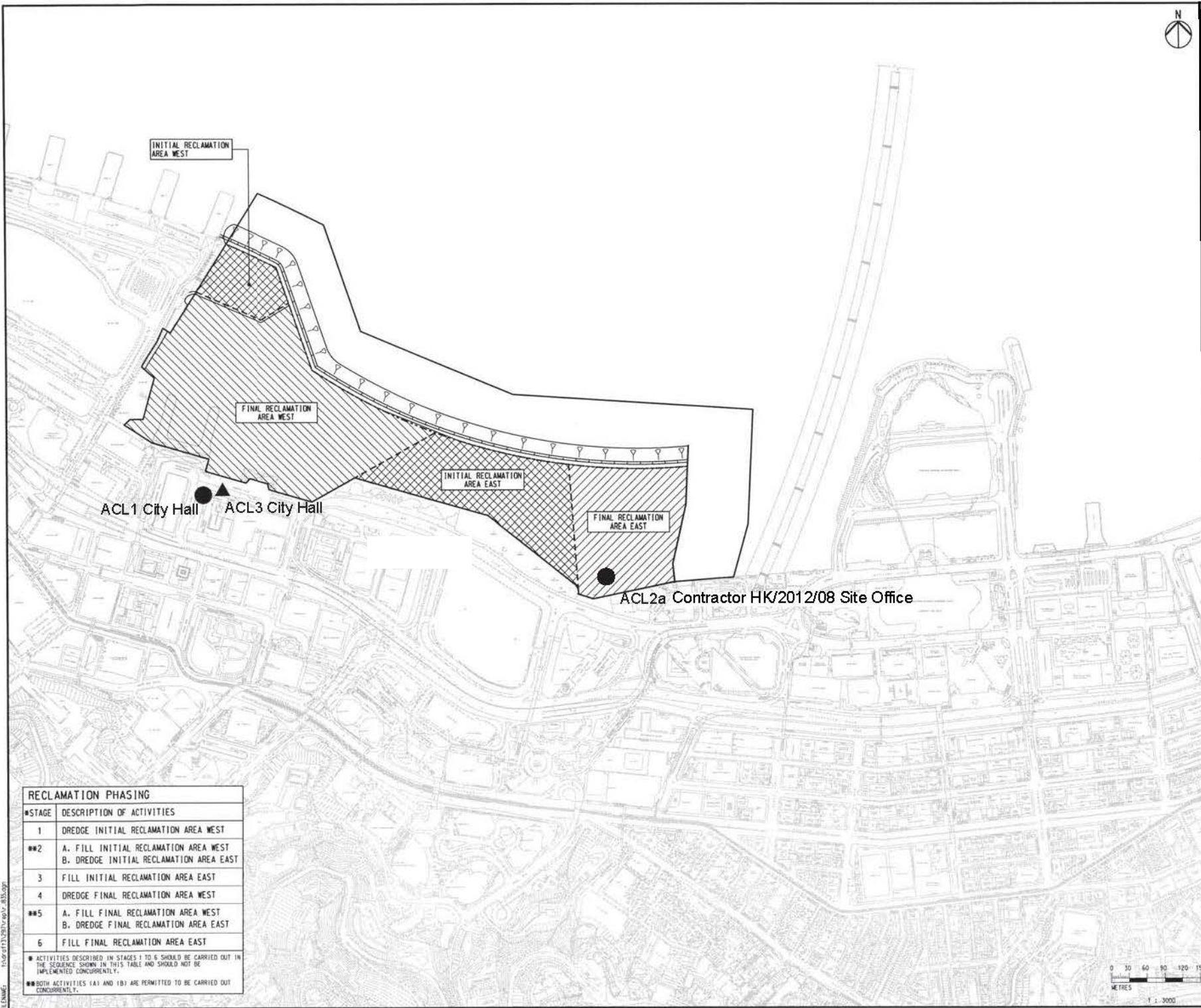
Locations of Environmental Monitoring Stations

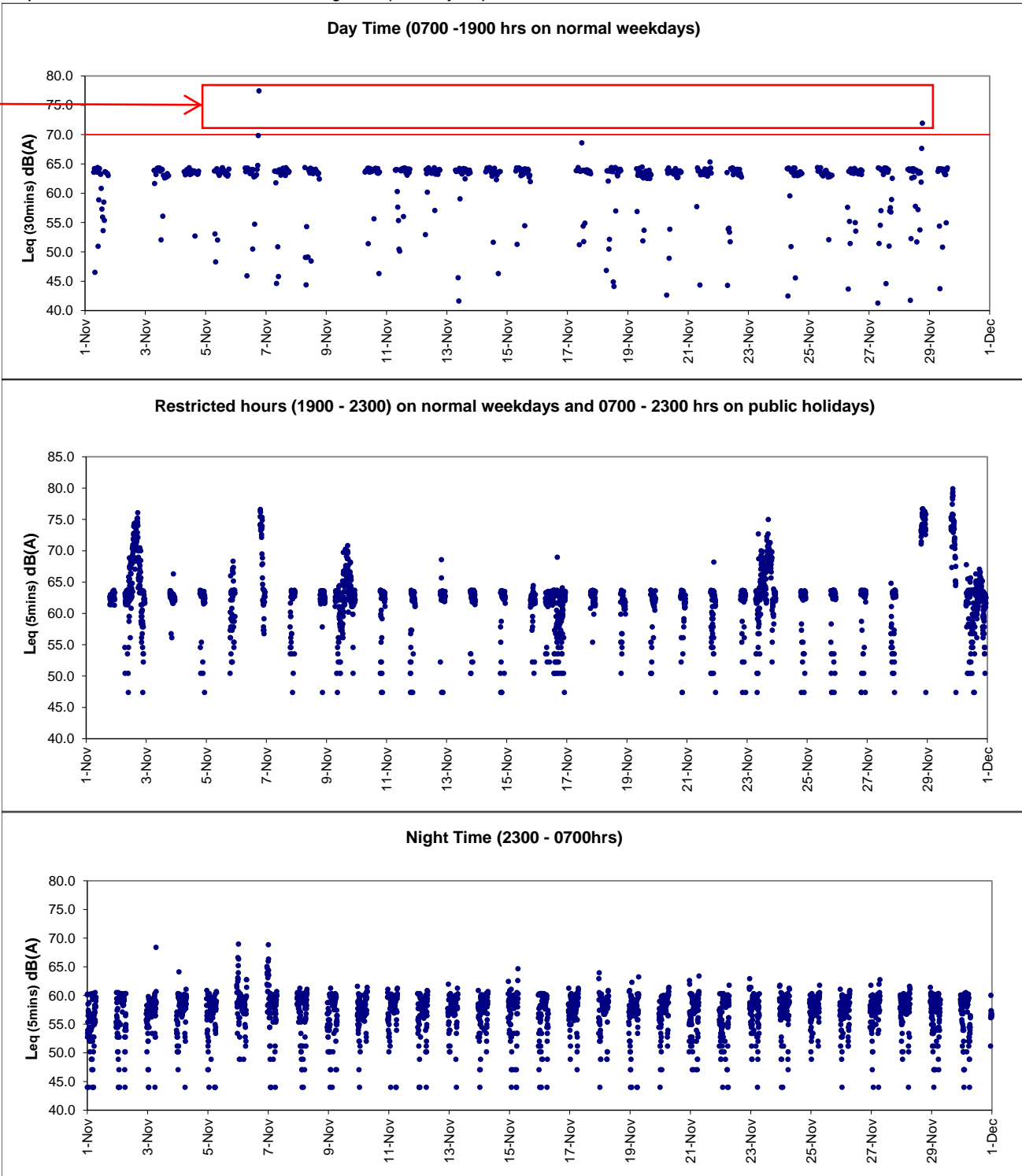

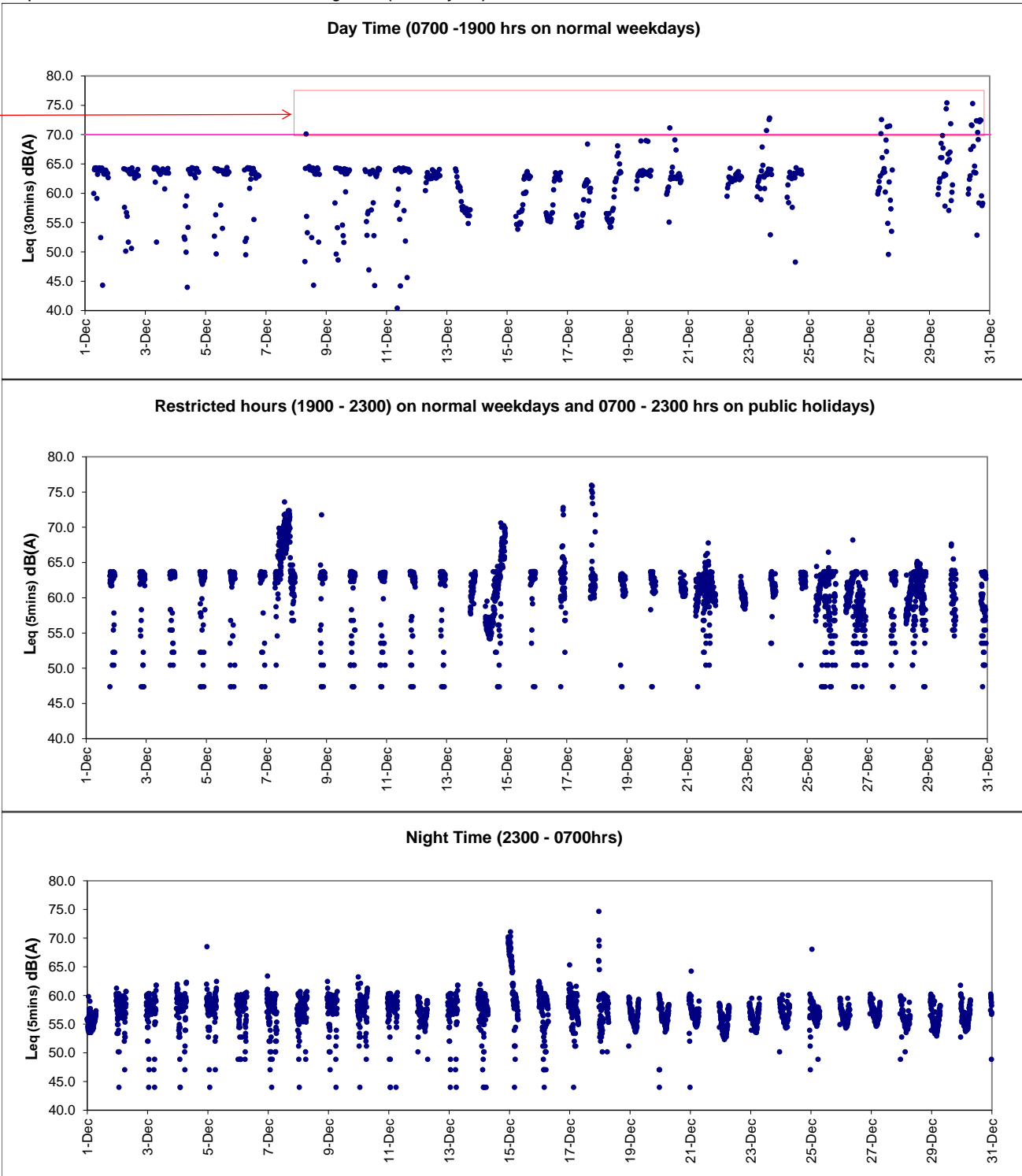

Graphic Presentation of Continuous Noise Monitoring Result (ACL3-City Hall)



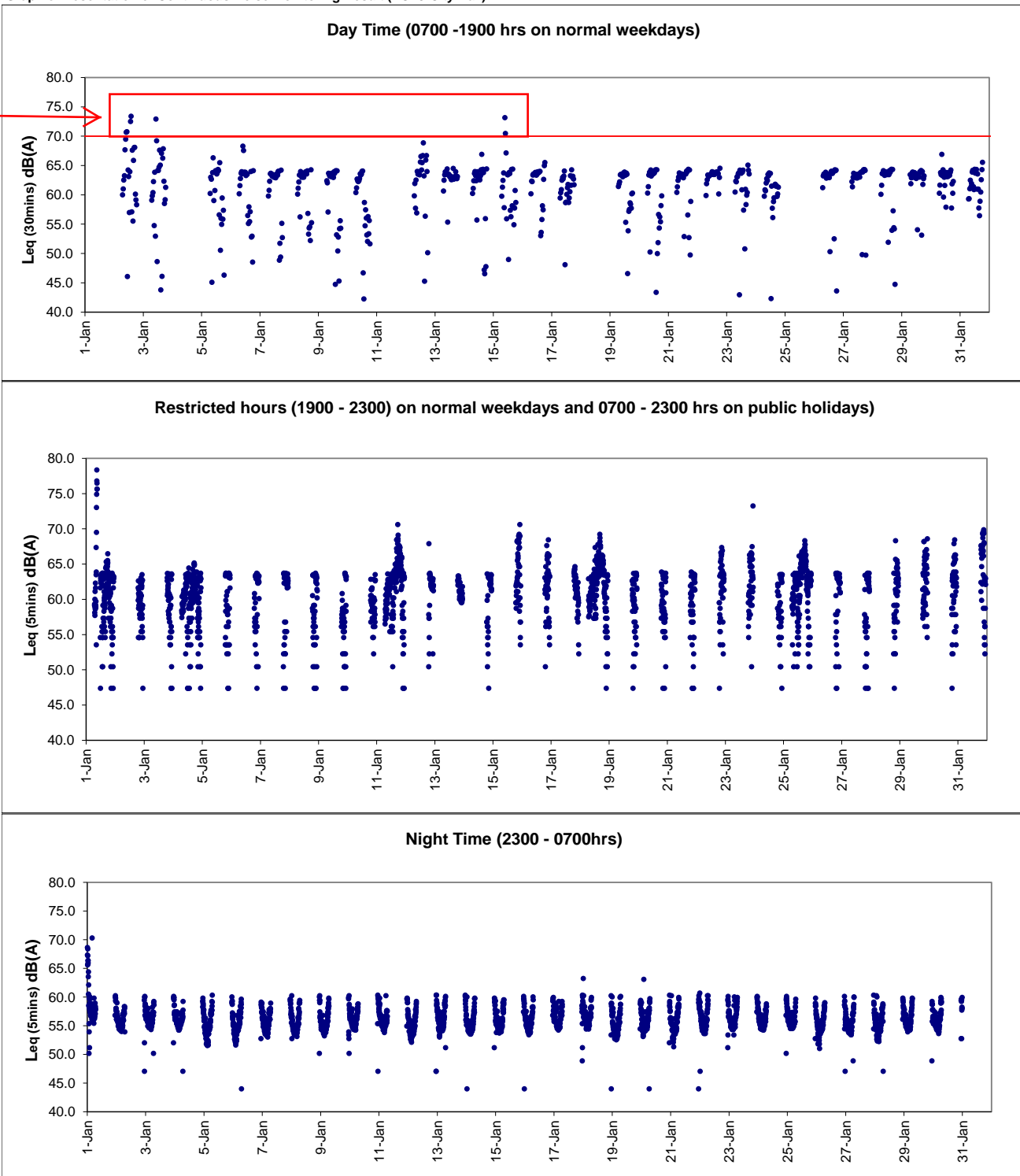

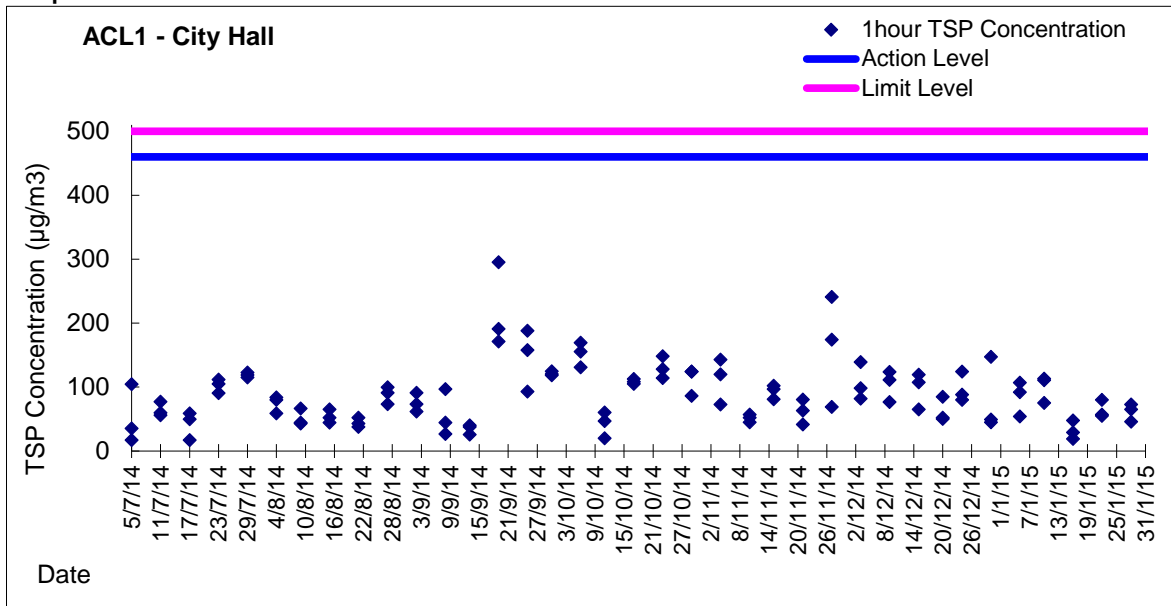

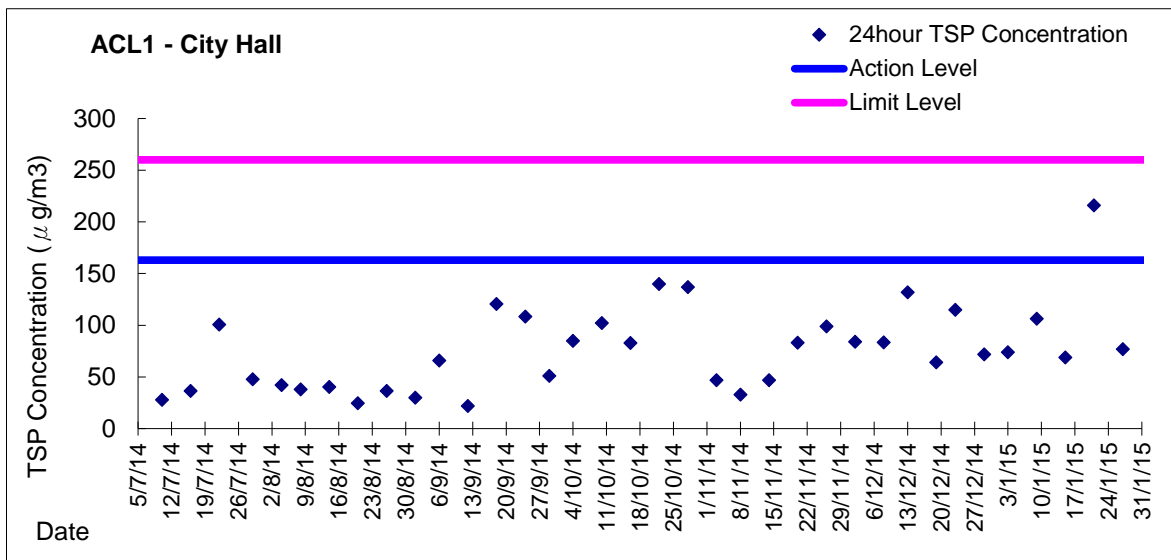

Graphic Presentation of 1 hour TSP Result

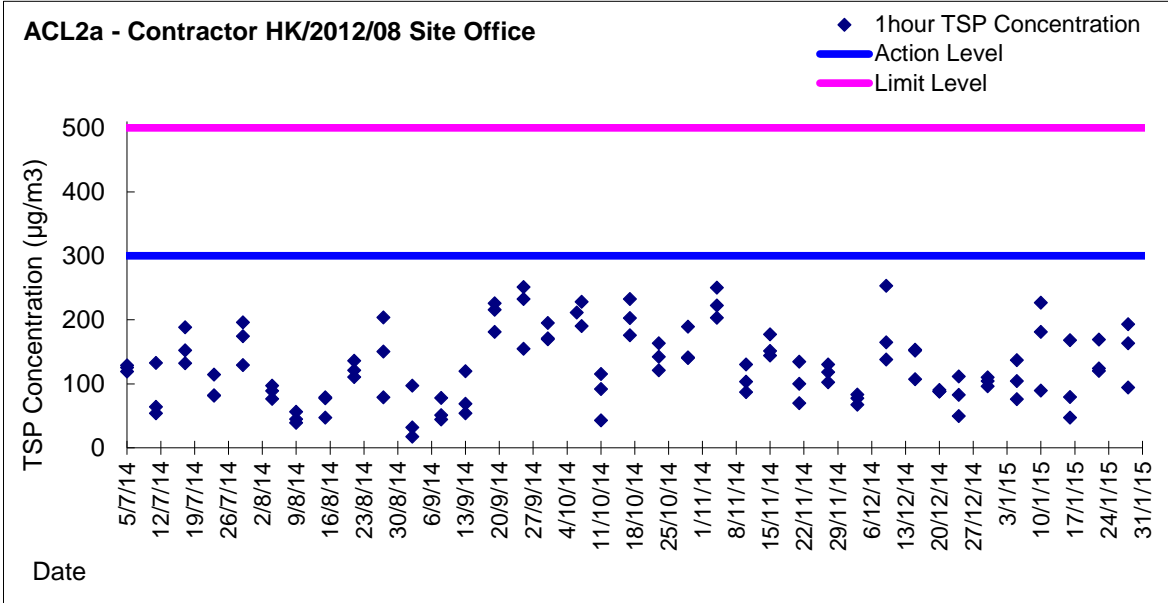


Graphic Presentation of 24 hour TSP Result

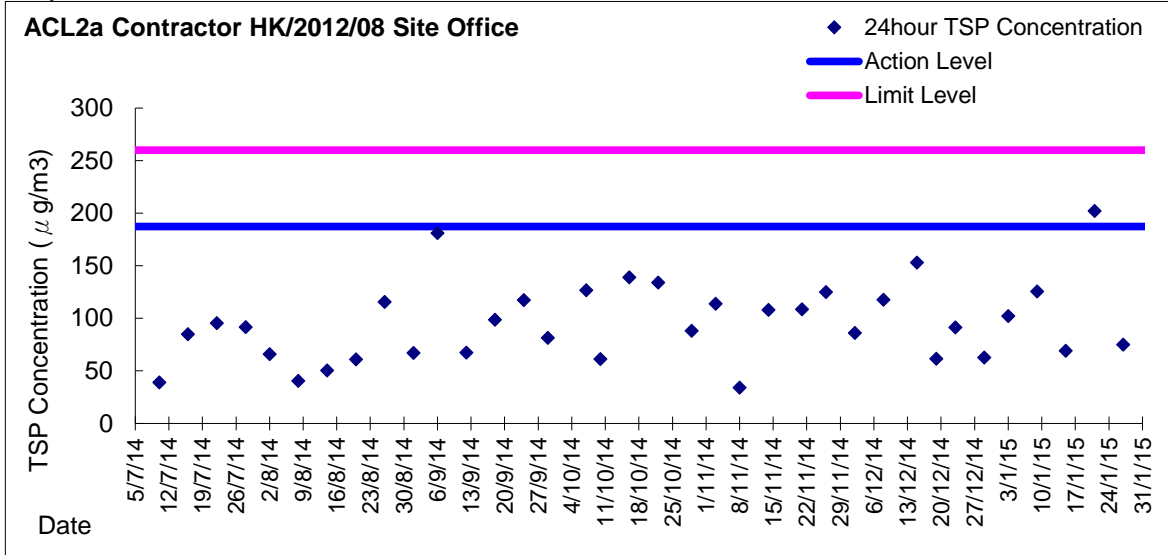




Graphic Presentation of 1 hour TSP Result

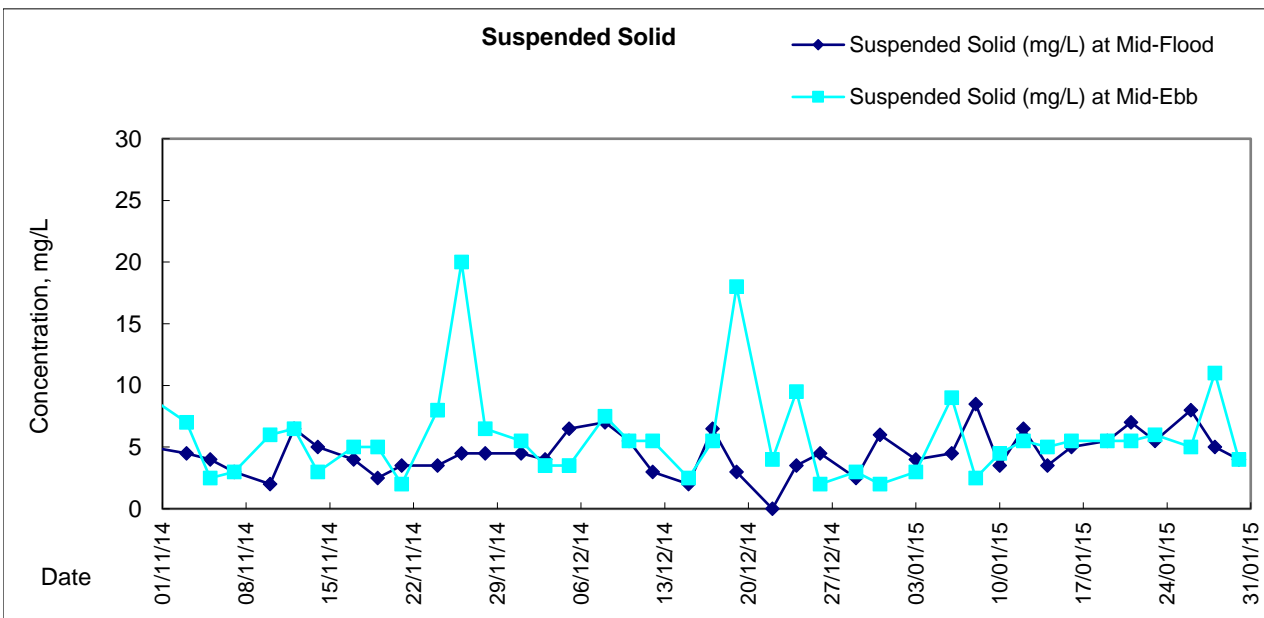
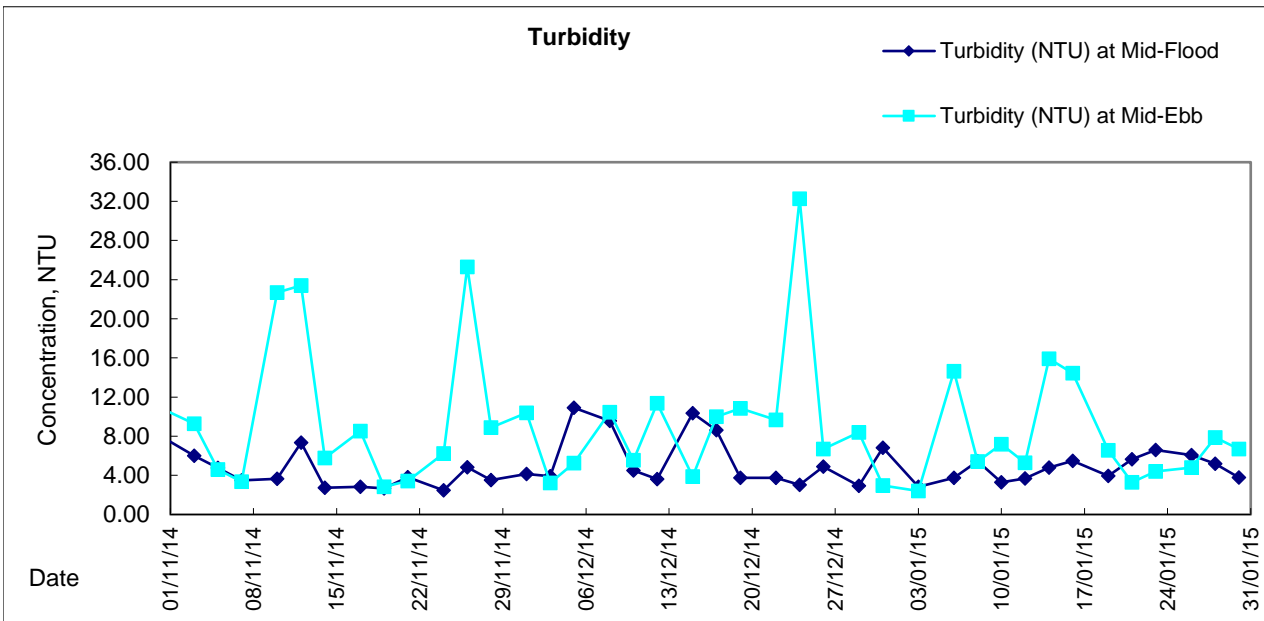
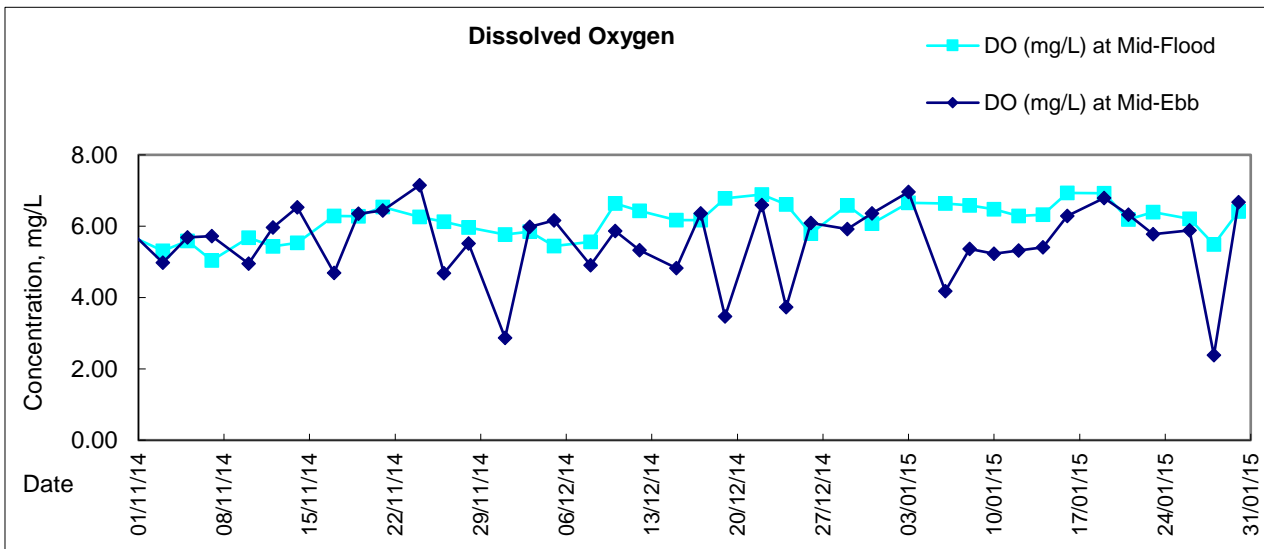


Graphic Presentation of Water Quality Result of M5B - Central Cooling Water Intake Groups
